Aruego, Jose and Ariane Dewey. *The Last Laugh*. 2006. A wordless tale in which a clever duck outwits a bullying snake.

Berenstain , Stan and Jan. *Berenstain Bears and the Bully*. 1993. When she takes a beating from the class bully, Sister Bear learns a valuable lesson in self-defense and forgiveness.

Carlson, Nancy. *Loudmouth George and the Sixth Grade Bully*. 2003. After having his lunch repeatedly stolen by a bully twice his size, Loud Mouth George and his friend Harriet teach the bully a lesson he'll never forget.

Bottner, Barbara. *Bootsie Barker Bites*. 1992. Bootsie Barker only wants to play games in which she bites, until one day her friend comes up with a better game.

Caple, Kathy. *The Wimp*. 1994. Arnold the pig and his sister Rose give two bullying classmates a taste of their own medicine when Arnold decides he doesn't have to be a wimp anymore.

Caseley, Judith. *Bully*. 2001. Mickey has trouble with Mack, a bully at school, until he decides to try being nice to Mack and making him a friend.

Christelow, Eileen. *Jerome Camps Out*. 1998. Jerome the alligator is looking forward to the Swamp School camping trip, until he and his friend learn that Buster, the class bully will be there too.

Cole, Joanne. *Bully Trouble*. 1989. Arlo and Robby, finding themselves the victims of a neighborhood bully, work out a red-hot scheme for discouraging him. **JER-3 Cole**

Crocker, Nancy. *Betty Loue Blue*. 2007. Teased by other children because of her big feet, only Betty Lou can save her tormenters one snowy day.

Cuyler, Margery. *Bullies Never Win*. 2009. First grader Jessica worries about everything Brenda the bully might tease her about until the day she has had enough and discovers a new way to deal with Brenda.

Emberley, Ed. *Bye Bye, Big Bad Bullybug!* Die-cut pages reveal the scary and mean parts of a bullybug, but just as it is about to attack some "itty-bitty" baby bugs, the bullybug is chased away until it learns to behave. **JJF Emberley (Toddler)**

Henkes, Kevin. *Chrysanthemum*. 1991. Chysanthemum loves her name until she starts going to school and other children make fun of it.

Keats, Ezra Jack *Goggles*. 1998. Two boys must outsmart the neighborhood bullies before they can enjoy their new treasure, a pair of lenseless motorcycle goggles.

Lester, Helen. *Hooway for Wodney Wat*. 1999. All of his classmates make fun of Rodney because he can't pronounce his name, but it is Rodney's speech impediment that drives away the class bully.

Londström, Lena and Olaf. *Four Hens and a Rooster*. 2005. When a small rooster in the barnyard turns into a bully, the four hens try to be nice. When that doesn't work, they take a class in self-esteem and learn to stand up for their rights.

Lovell, Patty. *Stand Tall Molly Lou Melon*. 2001. Even when the class bully at her new school makes fun of her, Molly remembers what her grandmother told her and she feels good about herself.

McCain, Becky. *Nobody Knew What To Do*. 2001. When bullies pick on a boy at school, a classmate is afraid, but decides that he must do something.

O'Neill, Alexis. *Recess Queen*. 2002. Mean Jean is the biggest bully on the school playground until a new girl arrives and challenges Jean to become her friend.

Otoshi, Kathryn. *One*. 2008. Offers the story of ill-tempered Red who got too powerful for his own good and had to be brought down to size by One – a single entity with the courage to stand up for what is right.

Pearson, Tracey Campbell . *Myrtle* . 2004. With the help of their Aunt Tizzy, Myrtle and her baby brother learn how to deal with a mean neighbor named Frances.

Polacco, Patricia. *Mr. Lincoln's Way*. 2001. When Mr. Lincoln, "the coolest principal in the whole world," discovers that Eugene, the school bully, knows a lot about birds, he uses his interest to help Eugene overcome his intolerance.

Wilhelm, Hans. *Tyrone the Horrible*. 1988. A little dino named Boland tries several ways of dealing with the biggest bully in the swamp forest, until finally hitting on a successful tactic.

Wishinsky, Frieda. *You're Mean, Lily Jean!* 2011 Sisters Carly and Sandy have always played together, but when Lily moves in next door she only wants to play with Sandy, and insists that if Carly joins them she must be a baby or a cow or a dog.
