Face to Face with Award-winning Illustrator and Caricaturist **Gerry Gersten**

Gerry Gersten, Ridgefield resident and famed caricaturist, will exhibit a diverse mix of portraits of literary and political figures, in a show entitled “Face to Face,” at the Ridgefield Library during August. An artist’s reception will take place on Saturday, August 9 from 2 – 4 PM.

Mr. Gersten’s powerful line drawings have appeared in the pages of *Esquire*, *Harper’s*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Time*, *Newsweek* and many other publications. His gift for grasping a character’s essential traits and attitudes has earned him national and international acclaim. He has received awards from The Society of Illustrators, The Art Director’s Club, and The Society of Publication Designers among others. His work has been exhibited at the Brooklyn Museum, the Spectrum Gallery and the Daz-Marcel Gallery in New York and in various galleries in Connecticut, including Weston where he lived prior to moving to Ridgefield.

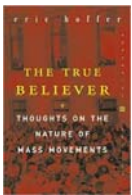

Completely relevant and essential for understanding the world today, *The True Believer* is a visionary, highly provocative look into the mind of the fanatic.

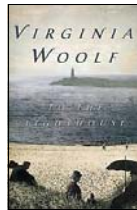


CRITICS' CIRCLE BOOK GROUP

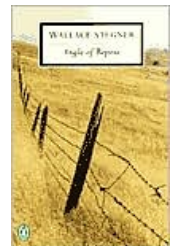

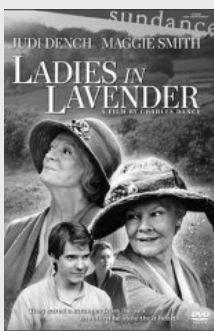

2007, PG-13, 92 Mins.

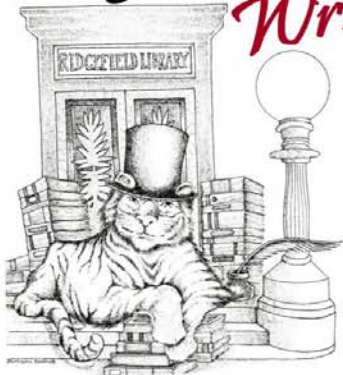

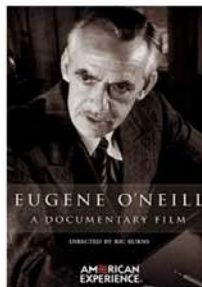
