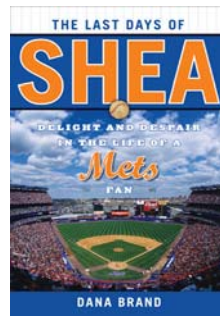
series featuring an English professor at a small New England college.

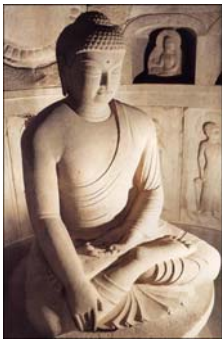

Enjoying Joyce @ the Ridgefield Library:

Our multi-part exploration of the life and works of James Joyce continues



The Library's multi-part, multi-media series, *Enjoying Joyce*, continues at **10 a.m. on Wednesday, February 24** with a book discussion of *A Portrait of the Artist as a Young Man* facilitated by Mary Rindfleisch,

Assistant Library Director.

Then begins a three-month exploration of Joyce's consummate work, *Ulysses*. On **Saturday, February 20 at 10 a.m.** Joyce enthusiast Colonel Jack Daniels will present a lecture called *Read Joyce? Are You Out of Your Mind?* The lecture aims to help readers approach this notoriously difficult novel. Mr. Daniels will also present a lecture about Joyce's life on **Thursday, March 25 at 7 p.m.** To further assist readers to get the most from *Ulysses*, Dr. Schenker will return to the Library on six **Thursday evenings at 7 p.m. (March 11, April 8, 29, May 13, 27, June 10)** to facilitate discussions. A limited number of free copies of the text are available at the Fiction Desk thanks to the Friends of the Library. Additional

copies can be purchased at Books on the Common for a 15% discount.

A film screening and discussion of the John Huston classic *The Dead*, based on one of the stories from *Dubliners*, will be led by Mark Edwards from the Media Studies Department at Sacred Heart University on **Saturday, March 13 at 10 a.m.** The musical duo Castlebay will help us celebrate St. Patrick's Day with a performance of *Songs of the Irish Poets* on **Saturday, March 20 at 2 p.m.**

The series will conclude with a Bloomsday celebration on **Wednesday, June 16**. There will be Irish music, Joyce-inspired refreshments, readings by local celebrities and dramatic performances throughout the day.

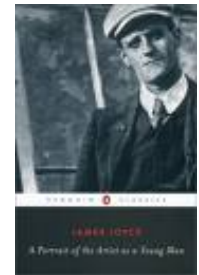

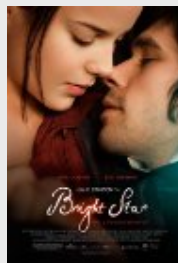


Hollister Films

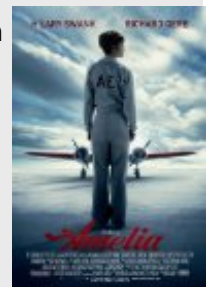
Tuesday, February 9
