After singing on the streets of her native Dublin as a teenager, **Susan McKeown** left for New York with a bursary from The Arts Council of Ireland and a scholarship to the American Musical & Dramatic Academy, and soon became a regular performer at the legendary East Village club Sin-E. Her debut album *Bones* (1995) garnered wide critical acclaim, established her reputation as an inventive songwriter with a powerful voice and set her on the road to an international touring and recording career. Ten albums later McKeown has a catalog of music that solidly spans the realms of world music and rock. She has worked with such luminaries as Natalie Merchant, Linda Thompson, Pete Seeger, Billy Bragg and Arlo Guthrie.
