To commemorate the 10th anniversary of 9/11 the Library will show the documentary *Q. What's Wrong With This Picture?* by Ridgefielder Jason Kessler. Kessler, an award winning filmmaker who lives less than a mile from the World Trade Center, recorded his own video journal in the days after the terrorist attacks. It is a powerful, articulate film about a neighborhood, a tragedy, and the first spasms of healing that followed. Above all, it is a valentine to a City that was supposed to have fallen apart, but that instead amazed us all. The 17-minute film will be shown continuously between 1 and 3 PM. Light refreshments will be served.

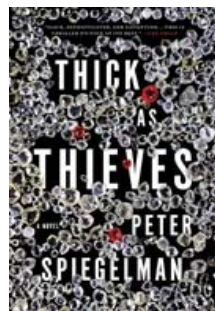
Thick as Thieves

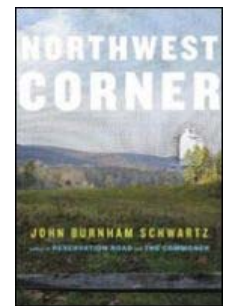

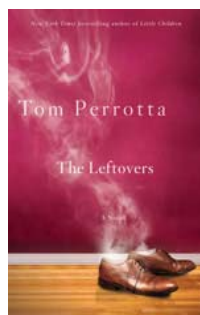

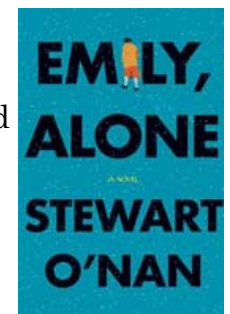
Emily Alone

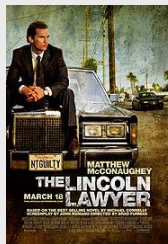

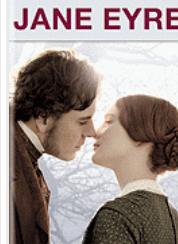
